### RE: City of Newton's Response to Michael J. Merritt's Complaint

This office and the undersigned have been asked to respond on behalf of the City of Newton, Iowa ("City") to the July 20, 2022, complaint by Michael Merritt alleging violations of Iowa Code Chapter 22 ("Complaint"). As an initial matter, Mr. Merritt's Complaint about the City of Newton appears to be the fifth such complaint he has filed with the Iowa Public Information Board ("Agency") over the last few months and the City questions whether this Complaint was filed in good faith compliance with the Iowa Code. As set forth by this Agency in the matter of *Michael Merritt and Guthrie County*, Case 22FC:0018, "Iowa Code section 23.8 requires that a complaint be within the IPIB's jurisdiction, appear legally sufficient, and have merit before the IPIB accepts a complaint." *See* attached Exhibit A, Dismissal Order. Similar to that case, the City requests this case be dismissed.

Mr. Merritt's Complaint is sixteen pages long and broken into nine paragraphs with thirteen subsections. *See* attached Exhibit B, July 20, 2022, Merritt Complaint. The Complaint is difficult to follow and understand, so the City's response addresses the allegations set forth in each separate paragraph/subparagraph of the Complaint. The City's response is intended to address all of Mr. Merritt's allegations; however, given the disjointed nature of the Complaint, if the City accidentally missed any argument that the Agency would like addressed, please let me know.

#### Paragraphs 1, 2 & 3:

Mr. Merritt's allegation is based upon a violation that supposedly occurred on June 23, 2022. *See* Exhibit B. Mr. Merritt made no open records request on July 23, 2022; however, he sent two records to the City on July 24, 2022. *See* attached Exhibits C & D, July 24, 2022, Merritt Requests. (Please note that Exhibit C was sent at 10:17 a.m. and demanded a response by 4:00 p.m. that day.) *See* Exhibit D. Mr. Merritt followed up with another email to the City dated June 28, 2022. *See* attached Exhibit E, Merritt Correspondence.

The City responded to Mr. Merritt's outstanding requests with an initial response on June 29, 2022, then provided a more detailed response on July 15, 2022. See attached Exhibits F & G, City Responses. The City's estimate of costs was over five thousand dollars due to Mr. Merritt's demand for copies of nearly every City email sent from January 1, 2021, through June 24, 2022 (i.e., an almost eighteen month period of time). Mr. Merritt's Complaint alleges—without providing any evidence—that the City's estimate of fees was "not consistent with fees charged by

other Iowa Agencies for similar records searches." See Exhibit B, p. 6. If Mr. Merritt objected to the cost of the response, he could have contacted the City to discuss the fees or minimize the cost of the response by amending his requests to reduce the number of months or employees included in the search. The City asks that this portion of Mr. Merritt's Complaint be dismissed because the City responded to Mr. Merritt's request and the reason Mr. Merritt does not have the requested records is that he has not yet provided payment for the records he requested.

### Paragraph 4(a):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a records request to Mayor Michael Hansen dated March 14, 2022. *See* Exhibit B, p. 1. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection 23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. *See* Iowa Code 23.7(1).

#### Paragraph 4(b):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a records request to City Clerk Katrina Davis dated March 14, 2022. *See* Exhibit B, p. 1. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection 23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. *See* Iowa Code 23.7(1).

## Paragraph 4(c):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a records request to Police Chief Rob Burdess dated April 1, 2022. *See* Exhibit B, p. 2. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection 23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. *See* Iowa Code 23.7(1).

## Paragraph 4(d):

In this subparagraph, Mr. Merritt alleges that Police Lieutenant Ron Cook violated Iowa Code Chapter 22 by engaging in "gender-based discrimination" when he did not provide a copy of an incident report. See Exhibit B, p. 2. Any allegations involving discrimination are beyond the scope of this Agency; however, the City strongly denies that it treats individuals differently based on membership in a protected class.

### Paragraph 4(e):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a records request to Police Lieutenant Chris Wing dated January 13, 2022. *See* Exhibit B, p. 4. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection 23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. *See* Iowa Code 23.7(1).

### Paragraph 4(f):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a response to a records request provided by Police employee Missy Graff. See Exhibit B, p. 4. The alleged violation of Iowa Code Chapter 22 appears to be that, in early 2022, Mr. Merritt was informed there was a \$10 fee to obtain an incident report, whereas a female who requested an incident report a few months later was only charged \$5. See id. This is Mr. Merritt's second allegation of gender-based discrimination. See Exhibit B, p. 2. As set forth above, any allegations involving discrimination

are beyond the scope of this Agency; however, the City strongly denies that it treats individuals differently based on membership in a protected class. In addition, the City would note that the Police Department reduced its standard fee for reports from \$10 to \$5 at the end of June/beginning of July—so it would be true that anyone requesting a report after the fee schedule changed would be charged a lesser amount than someone requesting a report earlier in the year.

### Paragraph 5:

Mr. Merritt provides no evidence in this subparagraph to support an alleged violation of Iowa Code Chapter 22.

### Paragraph 6:

Mr. Merritt repeatedly defames the City Attorney and other City staff in this subparagraph alleging unethical behavior, misrepresentation of facts, gender discrimination, and charging excessive fees to avoid providing records. If Mr. Merritt objected to the cost of any of the City's responses, he could have contacted the City to discuss the fees or amended his requests to minimize the cost. The City affirms that the costs quoted to Mr. Merritt to respond to his voluminous requests—including a copy of every City email for an eighteen month period—are based on the actual cost estimates to provide the records. All of the other allegations in this subsection are beyond the scope of this Agency.

Finally, the City would note that Mr. Merritt appears focused on the fact that he requested a copy of the "official portrait" of the Police Chief and Officer Zylstra on April 18, 2022, and the City responded that it has no official portraits of peace officers. See attached Exhibit H, April 18, 2022, Merritt Request, and Exhibit I, May 3, 2022, City Response. Mr. Merritt has decided that, since there is a picture of the Chief of Police on the City's website, the City's response was a misrepresentation. See Exhibit B, p. 6. The City states that there are a number of photographs of the Chief of Police available online but there is not an "official portrait" of the Chief or other officers.

#### Paragraph 7(a):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon records requests dated November 27, 2021, and December 3, 2021, as well as the City's response dated February 10, 2022.<sup>2</sup> See Exhibit B, p. 6. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection 23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. See Iowa Code 23.7(1).

## Paragraph 7(b):

Mr. Merritt provides no evidence in this subparagraph to support an alleged violation of Iowa Code Chapter 22.

#### Paragraph 7(c):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a records request dated January 4, 2022, as well as the City's response dated March 10, 2022. See Exhibit B, p. 9. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection

23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. *See* Iowa Code 23.7(1).

## Paragraph 7(d):

Mr. Merritt provides no evidence in this subparagraph to support an alleged violation of Iowa Code Chapter 22.

## Paragraph 7(e):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a records request dated March 14, 2022, as well as the City's response dated March 10, 2022. See Exhibit B, p. 10. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection 23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. See Iowa Code 23.7(1). Without waiving said objection, the City would note that—due to the multiple requests from Mr. Merritt to the City sent on a number of different dates—he was asked to let the City know if there was any additional information he was waiting to receive, yet he never identified any such information prior to filing his Complaint. See Exhibit I.

#### Paragraph 7(f):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a records request dated January 4, 2022, as well as the City's response dated March 10, 2022. See Exhibit B, p. 10. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection 23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. See Iowa Code 23.7(1). As mentioned above, there is no "official portrait" of the Chief of Police or Officer Zylstra.

#### Paragraph 7(g):

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon a records request dated June 24, 2022, as well as the City's response dated July 15, 2022. See Exhibit B, p. 11. Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph do not appear to involve a violation of Iowa Code Chapter 22 as it is merely a defamatory statement attacking the City's "integrity" because City staff previous provided some records to Mr. Merritt at no cost as part of a response that also include a fee estimate to provide the remainder of the requested records. See Exhibit B, p. 12. Again, if Mr. Merritt objected to the cost of any of the City's responses, he could have contacted the City to discuss the fees or reduce the total cost by amending his requests prior to filing his Complaint.

#### Paragraph 8:

Mr. Merritt's allegations in this subparagraph are based upon records requests that are more than two months old. See Exhibit B, pp. 13 & 14. The City respectfully requests that this portion of the Complaint be dismissed as Iowa Code Subsection 23.7(1) requires complaints to be filed within sixty (60) days from the date of the alleged violation. See Iowa Code 23.7(1). Without waiving said objection, and as mentioned previously, the estimate of costs to respond to Mr. Merritt's voluminous requests, including, but not limited to, a copy of every City email for an eighteenmonth period, are based on the actual costs to provide the records.

## Paragraph 9:

Mr. Merritt provides no evidence in this subparagraph to support an alleged violation of Iowa Code Chapter 22.

For the reasons set forth above, the City respectfully requests that Mr. Merritt's claim be dismissed. If additional information is needed to process this complaint, please let me know.

COMES NOW, Margaret E. Johnson, Executive Director for the Iowa Public Information Board (IPIB), and enters this Dismissal Order.

Michael Merritt filed formal complaint 22FC:0018 on March 9, 2022, alleging that Guthrie County (County) violated Iowa Code chapter 22. He provided documentation of a record request he filed on December 3, 2021, which requested copies of:

- 1. "City of Guthrie Center Information System End-User interaction with the following uniform resource locators (URL)" between January 1, 2017, and December 3, 2021. Twenty-four URLs were then listed.
- 2. "All Guthrie Center, IA end-user electronic mail/attachments mentioning domains in paragraph 1(a)."
- 3. All City of Guthrie Center emails or attachments including a list of 22 specific names from January 1, 2017, to December 3, 2021.
- 4. City of Guthrie incident reports regarding three named individuals.

He requested that the records be provided on a portable document format/thumb drive. The December 3, 2021, record request was sent to the Guthrie Center City Hall and a Guthrie County Sheriff's deputy.

Mr. Merritt alleged that the County did not provide the records and did not acknowledge his record request. On February 15, 2022, he sent a status request, this time including Guthrie County. This is the first time he included the County. He alleged that a Sheriff deputy responded, stating that the deputy wrote that he did not understand what records were being requested.

On February 17, 2022, Mr. Merritt sent a second status update request, this time requesting similar records from the County.

At the time of the filing of this complaint, Mr. Merritt alleged that he had not received any other contact from the County and had not received any records.

On March 22, 2022, the County responded to the complaint and stated that the County has no records responsive to the record request.

On April 4, 2022, the county attorney stated that the County was now aware of the records being requested and that a deputy was retrieving the records.

On April 6, 2022, the county attorney provided additional information. The delay in response to the record request was due to the deputy being on medical leave and because there was some confusion as to whether Mr. Merritt was requesting Guthrie County or City of Guthrie Center records.<sup>1</sup>

The county attorney added that the County does not record the information requested in item 1, above. The County also does not have any incident reports as requested in item 4, but could provide dispatch information.

The county attorney stated that a request would be made to search for the records requested in items 2 and 3. Those records were released on April 18, 2022. Copies of the calls for service logs requested in item 4 were also released.

All responsive records have now been released. The County stated that the record request was difficult to understand. Once the complaint was filed, it was quickly determined that two of the record requests described records that the County did not maintain or possess. The email records were retrieved and released in twelve days.

The Iowa Supreme Court provided some guidance on the timeliness of record release in *Horsfield Materials, Inc. v. City of Dyersville,* 834 N.W.2d 444, 461 (Iowa 2013):

Under this interpretation, practical considerations can enter into the time required for responding to an open records request, including "the size or nature of the request." But the records must be provided promptly, unless the size or nature of the request makes that infeasible.

According to an Iowa Attorney General Sunshine Advisory Opinion from August 2005, "Delay is never justified simply for the convenience of the governmental body, but delay will not violate the law if it is in good faith or reasonable."

In this case, the records request initially referenced only the City of Guthrie Center, creating some confusion as to which body was responsible for fulfilling the request. Any initial delay by the County was in good faith and reasonable.

Iowa Code section 23.8 requires that a complaint be within the IPIB's jurisdiction, appear legally sufficient, and have merit before the IPIB accepts a complaint. This complaint does not meet those requirements.

IT IS SO ORDERED: Formal complaint 22FC:0018 is dismissed as legally insufficient pursuant to Iowa Code section 23.8(2) and Iowa Administrative Rule 497-2.1(2)(b).

Merritt that are published publicly on the official City of Newton, IA website and Newton, IA Police Department Facebook page (Official Portrait of Chief Burdess). City Attorney Matthew S. Brick acknowledged having knowledge of both of these City of Newton, IA online assets in electronic mail he transmitted on 27 MAY 2022 at 0745 am. City Attorney Matthew S. Brick has produced evidence of possible use of excessive fees to prevent the release of records consistent with other behavior executed by City Attorney Matthew S. Brick. In contrast, the fees he has documented are not consistent with fees charged by other Iowa agencies for similar record searches. City Attorney Matthew S. Brick communicated in an electronic mail released on 15 JUL 2022 at 0850 am while responding to a request for the hourly rate for the City of Newton, IA records clerk, that the City of Newton, IA no longer has a records clerk. At the same time, communicating since 10 FEB 2022, the City of Newton, IA would have to charge thousands of dollars for the City of Newton, IA to search for records that have been requested. Evidence suggests that City Attorney Matthew S. Brick utilizes an array of tools while representing his clients that evidence indicates include misrepresentation of facts, vague, ambiguous assertions regarding requirements that are alleged to be necessary to search for requested records leading to excessive fees in this case for a city that he communicates on 15 JUL 2022 no longer has a records clerk.

This device, in the form of requesting excessive monetary compensation for the 8 search for records in this situation, may enable City Attorney Matthew S. 9 10 Brick not to be required to release records to a party that cannot afford the 11 communicated cost. Consequently, in this situation, it only shows evidence 12 that the City of Newton, IA does not know the use of their network assets 13 (possibly unethical/illegal) by users that have been granted access to their 14 information systems. The City will begin preparing a response to your requests upon receipt of payment. Finally, please note that the City no longer has a Records Clerk position." The integrity of this assertion can easily be questioned, given that City Attorney Matthew S. Brick provided eighty-six pages of City of Newton, IA electronic mail in his 10 FEB 2022 response with dates going back to 2019 at zero cost. Furthermore, electronic mail in a TCP/IP-based GOV, MIL, or corporate network environment is generally centrally stored on a mail server. This alleged

#### Chief Burdess:

I want to take this opportunity to communicate that I am sure it is obvious at this point that I don't agree with how the Newton, IA Police Department has historically handled issues involving my life, but I want to take this opportunity to communicate that I appreciate and respect the fact that the City of Newton, IA has not blocked me and evidence I have indicates you and your officers read my electronic mail or at the very least open them.

I was at the Newton, IA Police Department for approximately an hour to an hour and a half Friday night to speak with LT Wing who is usually cordial with me at Hy-Vee where I see him regularly. Even though I saw Newton, IA Police cars driving by the station and around nearby blocks numerous times while I waited I never got the opportunity to talk to LT Wing as I was told the second time I called your dispatch after waiting for an hour or so that LT Wing had been busy and had gone home.

I talked to LT Winchell I believe Saturday at approximately 1650 and he greeted me at the front door and spoke to me for I believe 30 - 40 minutes while he had his officers waiting for shift turnover. It was apparent that LT Winchell and I did not agree with what I believe the evidence I have shows or the historical handling of this situation by the Newton, IA Police Department. I want to communicate that LT Winchell who was the supervising officer of my restraining order violation investigation (according to your records) was professional, polite, and attentive to what I was trying to communicate. He listened to what I had to say and was professional and respectful toward me as a citizen, but at the same time I was able to detect emotional withdrawal possibly as I communicated to him due to his respect and adherence to the orders you have put out regarding this situation and communications with me.

In the United States Navy we have a custom of owning our failure, forgiving the failures of others and working together to make the operational capabilities of our ship better for the future with no regard for the trespasses of yesterday that were handled openly and honestly. In my strategic analysis of this situation it is my opinion that it is only a matter of time before I have access to the records I requested 6 months ago. I think the reason I am emailing you is because I no longer feel a grievance toward the City of Newton or it's Police Department. It disappoints me that you guys will not sit down and talk to me openly and honestly and look at the evidence I have provided you and honestly look me in the eyes and communicate, "Merritt, you know it is possible we fucked this up." I think all I am wanting is to feel heard and acknowledged by the city I live in

I spent my entire career managing, leading, and training users of cryptographic assets that were reportable to the National Security Agency. When I was deployed on the USS Bataan in 2007 (I believe we were in the Persian Gulf at the time) it was around 0300 we were all tired, evidence would indicate I became complacent after doing the same 12 hour watch possibly for over a month or more straight and I accidentally deleted the cryptographic key approximately 1 hour early that the flag ship I was stationed on utilized to provide SHF bulk encryption. This occurred because I was not paying attention to details and I made a mistake that ends careers and leads to non-judicial punishment in accordance with the Uniform Code of Military Justice where people lose rank, pay, and benefits. Shortly after that mistake Murphy's Law being what it is the communications circuit that used that key went down due to signal loss or a possible cryptographic failure requiring the key that I had already destroyed to restore the circuit providing afloat internet, electronic mail, voice, and data services for a few thousand users including ships company, command staff, and an embarked Marine Expeditionary Unit. When we went into our safe to get the key needed to reload the circuit it became apparent that myself and my fellow watch stander (2 people are required for destruction) destroyed the key accidentally approximately 1 hour earlier than we were supposed to and we had no way to restore communications for the entire ship until the next key was scheduled for use nearly 40 minutes later. In that moment I felt immediate panic because I realized my career was over and I was about to possibly lose my rank, pay, and benefits that my family depended on. I sat at my desk staring at the top of the desk for a few moments while the watch standers I worked with scrambled to come up with an excuse (i.e. signal loss, attenuation, weather) for why the entire ship was down and unable to communicate with units on the beach and back in CONUS (Continental United States). I realized in that moment that I would rather burn in that moment and safeguard the lives of others while taking ownership for my failure than burn in eternity and take the easy path while putting those I serve with in danger by misrepresenting the true reason why we were down. I went up to my Chief (Chief Lee Meadows) I looked him in the eyes and I told him, "Chief we are down right now on SHF because I fucked up, I destroyed the key we need to reload the circuit early." My Chief looked at me and my recollection is that he didn't say anything, he turned around went to the vault and reissued a spare key and we restored the circuit.

The next day our Division Officer and my Chief's boss became aware that a key was reissued, I got dragged out of my rack while I was asleep in between watches and got the ass chewing of my life, but I never went to Captain's mast or received non-judicial punishment. I believe because the Chief I reported myself to respected my honesty and protected me from that. I retired from the United States Navv in July 2017 with 20 years of honorable service not because I never



made a mistake, but because when I did I was honest and I reported myself to my superiors so I could maintain my honor and receive assistance with fixing the problem that I had caused.

While raising my Son James whom I have not seen since 2017, and who now rarely talks to me because of the damage my ex-wife has caused. I taught him based upon this life experience. If you screw up and you are honest and let me know, I am going to talk to you about it but you are going to have my respect because you had the courage to stand in the light and acknowledge your failure. If you screw something up and you cover it up I am going to talk to you about the failure, but more important the loss of trust your desire to conceal the truth from me has created.

My only desire in this situation is the pursuit of truth so that I can help fix the problems that exist in our system that led to the damage that has been caused to the life of my children and my life. A lot of your officers publish very spiritual and religious content on social media indicating they should understand this concept: I have no desire nor do I feel the City of Newton, IA owes me financial compensation for damages I have allegedly incurred while living in the City of Newton, IA because when my Lord Jesus Christ was crucified by the Romans he did not take the Romans to civil court the day after he was resurrected. He spoke the truth and spread the good news to help others understand and know God's love and grace.

We live in a capitalistic republic where people have this entitled attitude that when they experience loss someone else should have to pay for it. I believe that when you experience loss we should execute actions to protect others from experiencing that loss. Execute actions that allows others to profit off of our loss while preventing them from experiencing it not pursue something only for ourselves.

I lost my children, there is nothing I can change about that. Evidence indicates the Newton, IA Police Department has executed prejudice against me regarding investigations it has handled or assisted the Marshalltown, IA Police Department, and failed to properly investigate a restraining order violation I reported to your department; there is nothing you can do to change that. What we can do is work together to ensure it doesn't happen to someone else. What you can do is take the time to talk to me in person and shake my hand and apologize and communicate to me you are going redouble your efforts to ensure these mistakes do not happen again. You can execute actions to ensure those that concealed my children do not coordinate filed trips for your own and the citizens that you serve.

All we can do is learn from the past with open communications among ourselves so that we can build a better future.

Mr. Merritt,

This email is to provide you with the cost to respond to your records requests dated June 24, 2022 and June 28, 2022. As previously mentioned, the response to these requests will involve a considerable amount of time and cost to compile, which will need to be paid before the information will be provided.

The City's email network retains emails for thirty days so, based on the dates your provided, there are no records responsive to your request on the email network. While some employees retain emails longer than thirty days on their Outlook profile, the City's IT staff would be required to login under each employee's Outlook profile to search for the keywords specified. The estimate to perform this work would be approximately 210 hours, which could be reduced if you would choose to narrow your request to identify specific employees and/or email addresses to search. Once the emails, if any, are found it will take additional time to review and redact any confidential information. An estimate of that cost cannot be provided until the IT search has been completed.

The cost for the IT staff to search every employee's Outlook profile for the keywords in your records requests would be \$5,317.20, which is based on a 210 hour search at a cost of \$25.32 per hour. The City will begin preparing a response to your requests upon receipt of payment.

Finally, please note that the City no longer has a Records Clerk position.
